Course Description:

Learning Outcomes:

Understanding Legal Compliance for Nonprofits: Students identify key legal requirements for nonprofit organizations, differentiate from for-profit entities, explore benefits of nonprofit status, and learn tax considerations. Governance, documentation, conflicts of interest, and board responsibilities are covered. Mergers, asset sales, and stakeholder protection are discussed. Dissolution process, asset distribution, and case studies are explored. Donor benefit and tax deductibility concepts are understood. Leadership transitions, onboarding, change management, and ethical culture creation were addressed. The curriculum will equip participants with nonprofit legal compliance knowledge and practical skills.
